LAUNCH OF U.S.-BANGLADESH BUSINESS COUNCIL



Bangladesh Embassy in Washington DC, in tandem with the U.S. Chamber of Commerce, organized the launching of the U.S.- Bangladesh Business Council, which will focus on advocacy and engagement to strengthen the bilateral commercial partnership between the two countries. Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina formally announced the launching of the council Council and delivered her keynote remarks in a virtual event on 06 April 2021. She stressed on the adequate policy support to further expand the bilateral trade between the U.S. and Bangladesh. She also expressed hope that the U.S.- Bangladesh Business Council will help expand the economic partnership between the two countries. ICT advisor to Prime Minister Mr. Sajeeb Ahmed Wazed, in his remarks, highlighted how Bangladesh became an ICT hub following the vision of 'Digital Bangladesh.' The inauguration of the Business Council is a milestone event in Bangladesh-U.S. economic ties and a significant achievement on the 50th anniversary of Bangladesh and the birth centenary of the Father of the nation, Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman.

BANGLADESH AND THE U.S. TO WORK TOGETHER TO ADDRESS THE CHALLENGES OF CLIMATE CHANGE





U.S. Special Presidential Envoy John Kerry visited Bangladesh on 09 April 2021 to extend the invitation of the U.S. President Joseph R. Biden to Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina to participate in the 'Leaders Summit on Climate' on 22-23 April 2021. During the visit, John Kerry met with Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina and Foreign Minister Dr. A.K. Abdul Momen, and other ministers and senior officials. The meetings mainly focused on how Bangladesh and other climate-vulnerable countries could work more closely with the U.S. to advance climate resilience and adaptation and raise ambition for mitigation efforts in the run-up to COP26 in Glasgow. The Foreign Minister sought the U.S. support for increasing global climate ambition and commitment to accelerate the Paris Agreement's implementation. Mr. Kerry was highly appreciative of Bangladesh's adaptation and mitigation efforts. He also praised Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina for her leadership in the Climate Vulnerable Forum (CVF).

invading forces of Pakistan on the night of 25 March 1971. In his speech, Ambassador M. Shahidul Islam called upon all to work hard to overcome the adversities and bring the benefits of independence to every citizen. A documentary titled "Genocide in 1971 and the Killing Fields" was screened at the event. A special prayer was offered seeking the divine blessing and peace of 1971 and in the nine months of the liberation war.

The Ministry of Foreign Affairs organized a day-long visit on 03 April 2021 to

Bhasan Char for High Commissioners/Ambassadors based in Dhaka. The group comprised Heads of Missions of Turkey, the EU, the U.S., UK, France, Germany, Japan, Australia, Canada, and the Netherlands. The diplomats visited various infrastructural facilities in Bhasan Char including embankments, buildings, shelters, and observed several capacity-building projects such as sewing, handicrafts making. The envoys freely interacted with the Rohingyas. During the interactions, the Rohingyas thanked Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina for the exemplary humanitarian support extended to them since they fled genocide in Myanmar. At the same time, they expressed their willingness to return to their homes in Myanmar. The trip was preceded by a UN team's visit from 17-20 March 2021. Earlier on 28 February 2021, a team led by the Assistant Secretary-General of the OIC also visited Bhasan Char.
